

MARATHON SUBWAY DUO STAR IN '24'

August 25, 2006 -- After riding the subway for two minutes and a day, MTA marathoners Matthew Green and Donald Badaczewski emerged from a No. 6 train yesterday morning beaming with pride and demanding a toilet.

They exited the turnstiles at the Pelham Bay Park station in The Bronx and raced for the restrooms at a Dunkin' Donuts, having broken the unofficial record for passing through every subway station with a time of 24 hours, two minutes.

"All I need right now is a bathroom and a bed," Badaczewski, 24, said after the 6:06 a.m. completion.

Guinness officials say the feat does not break the world record of 26 hours and 21 minutes that Kevin Foster set in 1989, because the duo's trains did not stop at every station.

"What they did was impressive, but if you're going after a record, why not go all out?" said Foster.

Green, an engineer, and Badaczewski, a law student, said they did not care.

And after they were done with their feat, they went home - by subway.
